## **Regular Session -**

The City Council of the City of Lanett, Alabama, met in a regular meeting on Monday, May 5, 2025, in the Council Chambers of the Lanett Municipal Complex at 6:00 P.M.

Councilmembers present were Tony Malone, Tamalita Autry, Ronnie Tucker, and Angelia Finley Thomas. Mayor Jamie Heard presided over the meeting.

Officer T.J. Wood said the invocation and Mayor Heard led the pledge of allegiance.

Councilmember Malone made a motion to approve the agenda. Councilmember Autry seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

Councilmember Tucker made the motion to approve the minutes of April 22, 2025, Council Meeting. Thomas seconded the motion. Motion unanimously carried.

Under Old Business, an Approval of Restaurant Retail Liquor License for Taqueria 2 Gallos De Oro LLC was brought forward. Councilmember Thomas made a motion and Councilmember Autry seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. Councilmember Malone asked about sufficient parking. Code Enforcement Officer Johnny Wood stated that the restaurant was in compliance with the Ordinance and the business next door presented documentation to him that he granted use of his parking lot to the restaurant. Malone requested a copy of the agreement.

Under New Business, Lanett High School Valedictorian Dominique Thompson was presented with a plaque by Councilmember Malone. Lanett High School Salutatorian and Miss LHS MaKiah White was presented with a plaque by Councilmember Autry, and Mr. Lanett High School Christopher King was presented with a plaque by Councilmember Tucker

Approval of Invoices was motioned by Councilmember Tucker and seconded by Councilmember Autry. Motion unanimously carried.

Resolution 05-25-01, a resolution to surplus vehicles at the Public Works building and an Ice Maker at the Nutrition Center was read by Councilmember Autry and

put in motion by Councilmember Tucker and seconded by Councilmember Autry. Motion unanimously carried.

Resolution 05-25-02, a resolution to amend Resolution 04-25-01 to surplus pump was read by Councilmember Autry and put in motion by Councilmember Tucker and seconded by Councilmember Autry. Motion unanimously carried. The Resolution originally stated that the pump was in the Waste Treatment plant but it actually was in the Water Department.

Resolution 05-25-03, a resolution for Municipal Water Pollution Prevention was read by Councilmember Thomas and put in motion by Councilmember Thomas and seconded by Councilmember Malone. Motion unanimously carried.

Resolution 05-25-04, a resolution for Determination of Weed Nuisances and Authorization of Action was and put in motion by Councilmember Malone and seconded by Councilmember Thomas. Motion unanimously carried. Johnny Wood stated that there would be a public hearing on June 2<sup>nd</sup> for those that did not respond.

Resolution 05-25-05, a resolution for Back-to-School Sales Tax Holiday was read by Councilmember Autry and put in motion by Councilmember Malone and seconded by Councilmember Thomas. Motion unanimously carried.

Resolution 05-25-06, a resolution to renew the 9-1-1 Dispatch Agreement was read by Councilmember Thomas and put in motion by Councilmember Thomas and seconded by Councilmember Tucker. Motion unanimously carried.

Resolution 05-25-07, a resolution to accept an Alabama State Fraternal Order of Police Grant was read by Councilmember Autry and put in motion by Councilmember Malone and seconded by Councilmember Tucker. Motion unanimously carried.

Council Member Malone had no committee report. He congratulated the students that were recognized.

Council Member Autry had no committee report. She thanked everyone for their participation in World Day of Prayer.

Council Member Tucker had no committee report. He congratulated the students as well and thanked the Chief for an issue.

Council member Thomas had no committee report. She congratulated the students that were recognized and reminded everyone about a June 8<sup>th</sup> Neighborhood watch community event to be held at W.O. Lance playground. She also stated that there would be a District 4 meeting on Thursday at the Nazarene Church

Council Member Dobbs was absent.

Electric and Gas Superintendent Allen Summers stated that regarding the PYMSA grant, we should be ready to receive bids by the end of the month. He also stated that due to maintenance there was a temporary power outage but notices were put on doors.

Mayor Heard thanked Rev. Hansen and the Restoration Committee members. He let the students know how proud he was of them and stated that some were his former students as well as his neighbors.

Mayor Heard asked for a motion to adjourn. Malone made the motion and Thomas seconded. Motion carried unanimously. The meeting was adjourned at 6:33
